#### **Community Benefit Fund**

The Community Benefit Fund (CBF) was established to provide funding support for gambling-related research and amelioration programs concerned with problem gambling, as well as community benefit grants which provide assistance for general community development and improvement purposes.

Section 68A of the Gaming Control Act 1993 (the Act), provides that:

- (1) The Director of Gaming Control (the Director) must maintain in the Agency's Operating Account a fund to be known as the CBF;
- (2) Money in the CBF is to be applied for the following purposes:
  - (a) research into gambling activity, including the social and economic impact of gambling on individuals, families and the community;
  - (b) promotion of community awareness and education in respect of problem gambling and provision of counselling, rehabilitation and support services for problem gamblers and their families in the Territory;
  - (c) funding of grants for community projects and services of benefit to communities throughout the Territory; and
  - (d) management and administrative support of the Fund.

The CBF receives a 10% levy on player loss from electronic gaming machines in casinos and licensed hotels, unclaimed prizes paid to the Director and proceeds from items forfeited under the Act. Each year the responsible Minister determines how this money will be distributed by the fund within the four categories listed above.

#### Administrative responsibility

The Act provides that the Director has responsibility to maintain the CBF. The Director's administrative duties in relation to the Fund can be broadly summarised as:

- maintaining the CBF in the agency operating account
- determining the revenue of the CBF through assessing gaming machine levy
- monitoring and reporting on club community contributions
- providing recommendations for Gambling Research, Gambling Amelioration and Minor Grants.

Licensing NT, a division within the Department of Industry, Tourism and Trade, is responsible for the coordination, management and administration of the program. This includes secretariat and executive support to the Community Benefit Committee (the Committee) as well as promoting the CBF within the wider community.

The secretariat is also responsible for the management of amelioration support and research activities, overall fund administration and general reporting of the program activities and progress to Government and other stakeholders.

#### **Committee membership and meetings**

The Committee is comprised of community representatives tasked with providing the Minister recommendations from all major category grant applications.

Community members of the Committee are appointed in an honorary capacity by the Minister. Nominal fees for attending Committee activities may be paid at the discretion of the Minister. Community members are also entitled to reimbursement for out of pocket expenses in meeting obligations arising from participation in Committee activities, consistent with normal government policy.

The Committee met on two occasions during 2021-22.

#### **Industry contribution to Community Benefit Fund**

The gambling industry is a major contributor to the Northern Territory economy, with significant investment, employment and taxation revenue effects. It is also a key element in the broader recreational, hospitality and tourism sectors.

However, the industry carries the potential for significant negative social consequences as a direct result of problem gambling aspects, particularly in regard to the operation of electronic gaming machines. To establish a responsible and balanced position for the industry, Government requires this sector of the gambling industry to contribute to measures that address the adverse effects it creates and, more generally, to improve the broader community environment within which the machines operate.

The required industry contribution is achieved in two ways:

- 1. through the imposition of a CBF levy on electronic gaming machine player losses from casinos and licensed hotels
- 2. by direct support to community improvement and development by licensed clubs operating electronic gaming machines.

#### Community Benefit Fund Levy - casinos and licensed hotels

The CBF is established under the Act to consolidate and manage the CBF levy collected from the operation of electronic gaming machines in Casinos and licensed hotels. Funding is directed to specific areas of activity as specified in the legislation.

#### Community support contributions - licensed clubs

As part of the arrangements for allowing gaming machines in community venues, clubs are required to make contributions to the local community and report those contributions on a regular basis. Guidelines exist to clarify what can be legitimately reported as a contribution.

Section 68B(1)(b) of the Act requires the Director to monitor the contribution made to the community by clubs that are licensed.

In 2021-22, community support contributions from licensed clubs totalled \$6.7 million, equating to 17% of net gaming machine revenue received. This represents an increase of 4% from the 2020-21 community support contributions, which were 13% of the net gaming machine revenue received, totalling \$5.7 million. (Table 9 refers)

#### COVID-19

The impact of COVID-19 is decreasing more and more as we progress to living with COVID. With lockdowns no longer being experienced, the revenue to the fund has been stable. The stability of revenue into the fund allows for longer term funding, predominately for Gambling Amelioration, to occur. Having long term funding agreements in the Gambling Amelioration space decreases administration and provides security of employment to staff engaged by organisations for these purposes.

One aspect of the fund that is still experiencing some COVID related issues is the Vehicle Gifting program. The global shortage of new vehicles as a result of COVID impacting supply lines has made it difficult to turn over fleet vehicles reducing the availability of vehicles to gift.

#### **Gambling Amelioration Grants**

The Gambling Amelioration Grants Program was established to support interventions that reduce problem gambling and minimise the harms that result from gambling. Interventions can range from community awareness and education programs through to the provision of counselling, rehabilitation or support services for problem gamblers and their families.

In 2021-22 eight gambling amelioration grants were funded a total of \$2 484 036 to provide gambling amelioration services:

- Amity Community Services Incorporated received \$719 435 for their ongoing gambling harm minimisation service and education program, which includes individual assessment and counselling, maintenance of its website and the Gambling Counselling Helpline. This was the fourth payment in a five year agreement.
- Somerville Community Services received \$778 907 to continue its problem gambling financial counselling service in Darwin, Palmerston and Katherine. This was the fourth payment of a five year agreement.
- Holyoake Alice Springs Incorporated received \$154 000 for their Sandplay in Schools program that seeks to provide support for younger children that are affected by harmful behaviours, including gambling. This was the first payment in a new five year agreement.
- Catholic Care NT received \$347 097 for their Gambling and Your Money Project which seeks to build a culturally safe, evidence informed and competent service provision across the NT, primarily in remote Aboriginal Communities. This is the first payment in a two year agreement.
- Yalu Marnggithinyaraw Aboriginal Corporation received \$50 0964 for their Yakka Gambling (no gambling) Family First program which seek to undertake a grass roots education program about the dangers of gambling in the remote aboriginal community of Galiwinku.
- Central Australian Aboriginal Congress Aboriginal Corporation received \$249 459 for their Gambling Harm Minimisation Social Marketing Campaign. This campaign seeks to raise awareness of the harms of gambling, initiate public discussion and reduce the stigma attached to seeking help.
- Gambling Help Online is a national approach by the states and territories to provide online assistance and counselling to people experiencing harm from problem gambling. In 2021-22 the Community Benefit Fund, through a gambling amelioration grant funded \$94 174 towards program.
- Hospitality NT received \$90 000 to deliver an industry driven education and training program coupled with the continued roll-out of the multi-venue self-exclusion platform that seeks to improve industry response and tools available to assist Territorians who are experiencing harm from gambling. This payment is the second payment in a three year agreement.

#### **Gambling Research**

While no gambling research funding was paid out in 2021-22, one new research project was approved for funding in the amount of \$348 511. Menzies School of Health Research successfully applied for a study to investigate gambling behaviours and capture lived experiences of gambling among culturally and linguistically diverse people in the Northern Territory. Subsequent to funding being awarded, at the request of the researchers, the management of this grant is being transferred to Flinders University resulting in the payment being processed after the close of the financial year.

#### **Major Community Organisation Grants**

The Major Community Grants Program was established in 2008-09 to provide funding support to not-for-profit Territory-based organisations for community development and improvement purposes. The maximum grant available for each project is \$250 000 and organisations can only have one active major grant at any time. Each year there are two rounds of assessments conducted for Major Grants. A regional summary of the Major Grants can be found at Table 2 and a list of successful applicants can be found at Table 6.

#### **Minor Community Organisation Grants**

Minor Community Organisation grants are available to support projects which have the potential to improve the wellbeing and lifestyle of Territorians. Funding for a wide range of purposes may be provided to eligible not-for-profit Territory-based community organisations.

The maximum amount that can be applied for is \$15 000. Funding is provided for non-recurrent expenditure and is available only for clearly identified projects which can be completed within specified time frames.

Priorities have been established for these grants and the two priorities identified in 2021-22 were for applications from Grass Root Organisations and applications that will have an ongoing benefit beyond the life of the grant.

#### **Vehicle Gifts**

The Community Benefit Committee considers applications for vehicle gifts and makes recommendations to the Minister. Gifted vehicles are ex-fleet vehicles that are scheduled for disposal by the Northern Territory Government via auction. The ability to gift vehicles this year was affected by the global shortage of new vehicles which reduced the ability to source new vehicles to replace vehicles scheduled for disposal. Consequently only one round of Vehicle Gifts were held in 2021-22 with 18 applications received and six vehicle gifts being approved.

#### **Major Community Event Grants**

Major Community Events funding provides support to not-for-profit Territory-based organisations to conduct community events. Funding is available for up to three years and requests can be made for anywhere from \$15 000 to \$250 000 per year. Two rounds were held this year and a regional summary of these Grants can be found at Table 5 and a list of successful applicants can be found at Table 8.
