

## Community Benefit Fund Committee

### Annual Report 2017-18

#### Highlights

- The Community Benefit Fund received \$11.968 million from the levy on electronic gaming machines in casinos and hotels during 2017-18.
- \$1.563 million was spent on gambling amelioration grants.
- \$6.293 million was spent on major community grants.
- \$1.888 million was spent on community organisations grants.
- Nine vehicle gifts were approved.

## Community Benefit Fund

The Community Benefit Fund was established to provide funding support for gambling-related research and amelioration programs concerned with problem gambling, as well as community benefit grants which provide assistance for general community development and improvement purposes.

Section 68A of the *Gaming Control Act*, provides that:

- (1) the Director-General must maintain in the Agency's Operating Account a fund to be known as the Community Benefit Fund; and
- (2) moneys in the Community Benefit Fund are to be applied for the following purposes:
  - a. research into gambling activity, including the social and economic impact of gambling on individuals, families and the community;
  - b. promotion of community awareness and education in respect of problem gambling and provision of counselling, rehabilitation and support services for problem gamblers and their families in the Territory;
  - c. funding of community projects and services of benefit to communities throughout the Territory; and
  - d. management and administrative support of the Fund.

The Fund receives a 10% levy on player loss from electronic gaming machines in casinos and licensed hotels, unclaimed prizes paid to the Director of Licensing and proceeds from items forfeited under the *Gaming Control Act*. Each year the responsible minister determines how this money will be distributed by the fund in terms of gambling amelioration, small and major community organisation grants and administration of the Fund.

The responsibility for assessing applications for funding falls on the Community Benefit Committee ('the Committee') which has been established to advise and assist the Minister responsible for the operation of the Fund.

The Committee also advises the Minister on the obligations of Territory licensed clubs with regard to the provision of direct community benefit contributions to their local communities, as required under the *Gaming Machine Act*.

### Administrative responsibility

Under the *Gaming Control Act* (the Act), the Director-General has responsibility to maintain the Community Benefit Fund (the Fund). The Director-General's duties in relation to the Fund can be broadly summarised as:

- maintaining the CBF in the agency operating account
- determining the revenue of the CBF through assessing gaming machine levy
- monitoring and reporting on club community contributions
- providing recommendations for gambling related research.

Licensing NT, a division of the Department of Attorney-General and Justice, is responsible for the coordination, management and administration of the program. This includes secretariat and executive support to the Committee as well as promoting the Fund within the wider community. The secretariat is also responsible for the management of amelioration support and research activities, overall fund administration and general reporting of the program activities and progress to Government and other stakeholders.

## Committee membership and meetings

The Community Benefit Committee (the Committee) comprised of 14 community representatives and one government representative.

Community members of the Committee are appointed in an honorary capacity by the Minister. Nominal fees for attending Committee activities may be paid at the discretion of the Minister. Community members are also entitled to reimbursement for out of pocket expenses in meeting obligations arising from participation in Committee activities, consistent with normal government policy.

## Industry contribution to Community Benefit Fund

The gambling industry is a major contributor to the Northern Territory economy, with significant investment, employment and taxation revenue effects. It is also a key element in the broader recreational, hospitality and tourism sectors.

However, the industry carries the potential for significant negative social consequences as a direct result of problem gambling aspects, particularly in regard to the operation of electronic gaming machines. To establish a responsible and balanced position for the industry, government requires this sector of the gambling industry to contribute to measures that address the adverse effects it created and, more generally, to improve the broader community environment within which the machines operate.

The required industry contribution is achieved in two ways:

1. through the imposition of a Community Benefit Fund levy on electronic gaming machine player losses from casinos and licensed hotels
2. by direct support to community improvement and development by licensed clubs operating electronic gaming machines.

### Community Benefit Fund levy – casinos and licensed hotels

The Fund is established under the *Gaming Control Act* to consolidate and manage the Community Benefit Fund levy collected from the operation of electronic gaming machines in Casinos and licensed hotels. Funding is directed to specific areas of activity as specified in the legislation.

### Community support contributions – licensed clubs

As part of the arrangements for allowing gaming machines in community venues, clubs are required to make contributions to the local community and report those contributions on a regular basis. Guidelines exist to clarify what can be legitimately reported as a contribution.

Section 68B(2)(b) of the *Gaming Control Act* requires the Community Benefit Fund Committee 'to monitor the contribution that clubs that are licensees under the *Gaming Machine Act* make to the community'.

In 2017-18, community support contributions from licensed clubs totalled \$4.9 million, equating to 16% of net gaming machine revenue received. This represents a decrease of 1% from the 2016-17 community support contributions, which were 17% of the net gaming machine revenue received, totalling \$5.302 million. (Table 8 refers)

### Community Benefit Fund Review

During the year, a review of the Community Benefit Fund was conducted to ensure the fund was achieving the best possible outcomes for the Community. Subsequent to the end of the Financial Year, changes to the legislation governing the Community Benefit Fund were approved by parliament and new categories and guidelines for the Community Benefit Fund were released. Changes to the fund include increased limits for Minor and Major Grants, a new category of funding for Community Events, and faster assessments times. Responsibility for assessing grants will now be shared between the Director-General of Licensing and the Community Benefit Committee.

## Gambling Amelioration Grants

The Gambling Amelioration Grants Program was established to support interventions that reduce problem gambling and minimise the harms that result from gambling. Interventions can range from community awareness and education programs through to the provision of counselling, rehabilitation or support services for problem gamblers and their families.

In 2017-18 seven gambling amelioration grants were funded a total of \$1 563 214 to provide gambling amelioration services. Three of these grants were multi-year agreements that had been awarded in 2015-16, while a fourth three year grant was awarded in 2016-17. The remaining grants were all for one year:

### Existing Multi-year grants

- Amity Community Services Incorporated received a three-year grant for a total of \$1 935 390 (\$644 790 in 2017-18) for their ongoing gambling harm minimisation service and education program, which includes individual assessment and counselling, maintenance of its website and the Gambling Counselling Helpline.
- Amity Community Services Incorporated received a three year grant for a total of \$610 000 (\$236 364 in 2017-18) to develop and trial a multi-venue self-exclusion system that is designed to supersede the current paper-based system and provide an easy one-stop-shop for an individual wishing to self-exclude from gaming venues.
- Somerville Community Services received a three-year grant for \$1 064 035 (\$372 117 in 2017-18) to continue its problem gambling financial counselling service in Darwin and Palmerston.
- Somerville Community Services received a three year grant for \$374 012 (\$130 800 in 2017-18) to provide an additional counsellor for their problem gambling financial counselling service in Darwin and Palmerston.

### Single year grants

- Indigenous Community Television Ltd received funding of \$95 216 for “Card Stories – Series Two”. This project will draw on the 2016 project “Card Stories” and will develop three new stories in conjunction with communities and Amity Community Services Inc. The stories seek to start a conversation that will promote education and encourage healthy gambling choices.. The stories will be played on ICTV over a one year period, as well as being available on demand and through social media and websites.
- Waltja Tjutangku Palyapayi Aboriginal Corporation received funding of \$40 376 for “Be Ninti about Gambling - 2017. This project aims to build on previous workshops to identify issues for young people and the challenges posed by problem gambling. The project will raise awareness in remote communities and provide strategies for dealing with problem gambling.

Gambling Help Online is a national approach to provide online assistance and counselling to people experiencing harm from problem gambling. In 2017-18 the Community Benefit Fund, through a gambling amelioration grant funded \$29 779 towards Gambling Help Online.



## Gambling research

Three research projects received funding in 2017-18 totalling \$623 201:

- In 2016-17 the Australian National University, Amity Community Services Inc and Menzies School of Health Research were successful in receiving funding of \$1 162 246 (\$355 001 in 2017-18) to develop and pilot a health promotion initiative addressing problem gambling in three remote indigenous communities.
- In 2017-18 the Australian National University was successful in receiving funding of \$250 000 to undertake a review of the Code of Practice for Responsible Gambling in the Northern Territory. The review will explore codes from elsewhere in Australia and overseas and will consult with stakeholders regarding the application of the current code.
- In 2017-18 the Northern Territory, through a community benefit fund research grant of \$18 200 continued its participation in Gambling Research Australia, which is a national approach to funding gambling research.

## Major Community Organisation Grants

The Major Community Grants Program was established in 2008-09 to provide funding support to not-for-profit Territory-based organisations for community development and improvement purposes. The maximum grant available for each project is \$200 000. In 2017-18 there were two rounds of Major Grants. A regional summary of the Major Grants can be found at Table 2 and a list of successful applicants can be found at Table 5.

## Small Community Organisation Grants

Community Organisation grants are available to support projects which have the potential to improve the wellbeing and lifestyle of Territorians. Funding for a wide range of purposes may be provided to eligible not-for-profit Territory-based community organisations.

The maximum amount that can be applied for is \$10 000. Funding is provided for non-recurrent expenditure and is available only for clearly identified projects which can be completed within specified time frames.

Greater consideration is given to priority issues such as level of existing community support and circumstances such as remoteness or high levels of socio-economic disadvantage. Preference is also given to requests for lower value amounts. This combined approach allows for an equitable distribution of available funds throughout the Northern Territory to as many worthwhile projects as possible.

Table 3 provides a regional summary of applications received and approved and a full list of successful applicants can be found at Table 5.
