

# McArthur River Mine Community Reference Group

## Member and Independent Chairperson selection criteria

Individuals recommended for appointment to the CRG would be:

- able to understand the material presented to the CRG and be in a position to clarify and convey any concerns the community may raise
- demonstrate impartiality and objectivity in accepting the information presented to the CRG by various parties
- of good reputation, integrity and credibility
- representative of the broader public, while representing a key stakeholder group that has an interest in the McArthur River Mine, particularly custodians and Traditional Owners.
- collaborative in their approach to sharing information obtained through the CRG with the community, via the key stakeholders they represent
- able to bring to the forum any matters of interest to those in the broader community for discussion, within the terms of reference for the CRG
- able to commit the time required
- aware of and prepared to declare and manage any real, perceived or potential conflicts of interest.

In addition, the Independent Chairperson must be able to demonstrate:

- experience as a chairperson of a group, who is held in high regard in civic life and has expertise in taking the community interests into account and experience in the position of chair
- a thorough understanding of good governance
- knowledge of general board and committee management principles
- extensive experience in being able to identify, manage and resolve conflict within the CRG.
